


## SEMAPHORE CODES


## THOUSANDS FLAG

To show thousands, hoist the 'thousands flag' (chequered) to the end of the yard arm and use the single units to show if the number is in the 1000s, 2000s etc.


The *Blue Peter* (or preparative flag) is used to indicate that communication is about to begin. The Blue Peter can also be hoisted to half mast to indicate a mistake. The *Tricolor* (or numerical flag) is used to indicate that a number, rather than a letter, word or phrase, is being sent.
